## Questions for Further Reflection

- 5. As you read through Job this past week (or listened to the sermon) how many of the friends' statements were things that you could hear yourself saying?
- 6. How do you feel reading God's rebuke of the friends and His defence of Job?
- 7. How does the ending of Job make you feel?
- 8. What is your role in God's wild and free creation? Where and how can you be a part of his unfolding wisdom?
