4. What has the big fish meant to you in this story? Do the scriptures regarding Israel being swallowed up change the way you read this passage?
5. How does viewing Jonah's being swallowed through the lens of deliverance change your understanding of this episode?
6. What are some positive things that we can take away from Jonah's prayer in chapter 2?
7. How do you think we can stay vigilant in our spiritual life?
8. When has God used difficult experiences to wake you up, grow you, or in some other way deliver you?
9. What parallels do you see between Jesus and Jonah (negative or positive)?
