Postcards from Corinth- pt. 8 The Way that Surpasses all Others I Cor. 13 June 15, 2025

- I. I Cor. 12 from 30,000 FEET (12:1-31)
 - A. Division over **SPIRITUAL** (you guessed it) **STATUS** (12:1-3)
 - B. One <u>GOD</u>, Many <u>GIFTS</u> (12:4-11)
 - C. One BODY, Many MEMBERS (12:12-30)

The Corinthians are so caught up in status that it is affecting the way they worship and come together as a church. Paul reminds them that the gifts they have all came from the same good giver and they are all members of the same body- the body of Christ!

- 1. Kid's Question: When have you been a part of a group or a team that felt bigger than yourself?
- 2. Have you ever felt pressure to "perform" spiritually, to measure up in some way? What brought on that pressure? Have you every felt spiritually superior/inferior to someone else? What do you think Paul would say about that?
- 3. What do you believe are your spiritual gifts?
- 4. When have you experienced that church acting as members of the body of Christ?
- II. I Cor. 13- in the <u>THICK</u> of it (13:1-13)
 - A. WITHOUT Love:
 - 1. WORDS lose MEANING (13:1)
 - 2. KNOWLEDGE loses SUBSTANCE (13:2)
 - 3. ACTIONS lose EFFECTIVENESS (13:3)
 - B. With Love, our LIVES are TRANSFORMED (13:4-8)
 - C. Love is the FUTURE we are LIVING into (13:8-13)

We have all heard this chapter at many a wedding. What if Paul is talking about more than romantic love and wants us to see how, in the church and in life, love is what holds all things together?

- 5. Is there a time when you have experienced the truths of I Cor. 13:1-3? When has the lack of love rendered others' words, actions, or knowledge fruitless? When has the same been true for you?
- 6. In what ways would your past week have been different if I Cor. 13:4-7 been your reality?
- 7. How does the picture of eternity being a place where only love remains affect you in the present?
- III. I Cor. 14- LIVING it out (14:1-40)
 - A. Love <u>BUILDS</u> up the <u>CHURCH</u> (14:1-19)
 - B. Love SEEKS our NEIGHBOURS' GOOD (14:23-25; Matt. 7:12; Matt. 22:40)

Paul goes on to show the Corinthians how the way of love should inform their worship as a community. If we were thinking first and foremost of love, how might our worship look different on a Sunday morning?

8. How do you presently build up the church or seek the good of those around you? Is that motivated by love?

IV. From CORINTH to HOPE

- A. You are the <u>BODY</u> of <u>CHRIST</u> (12:27; Eph. 1:23; Col. 1:18; Rom. 12:3-8)
- B. The WAY this Body WORKS is Through LOVE (I Cor. 14:1; 16:14)
- C. The Way of <u>LOVE</u> is the Way of <u>GOD</u> (I Cor. 13:4-8; I John 4:7-16; Phil. 2:5-11)

The reality is that when we being to experience the love God has for us, shown in Jesus, it changes everything. Everything we say, everything we know, everything we do.

- 9. Why do you think the metaphor of a body is so important to Paul?
- 10. How does reading I Cor. 13:4-8, replacing the word love with God, affect you? Are there phrases that give you pause? Do you really believe these things? What would happen if you did?
